Dear Parent/Carer

Year 11 is such an important year for our students and I know that I don't need to say how challenging it can be for them. However, along with the information included below, I feel confident that their maturity, their positive attitude and the one team spirit that so many of them have really shown this year, that we are going to see a fantastic set of personal and academic outcomes this year and I am certainly very proud to be their Head of Year. Hopefully this letter should help with any queries or concerns you might have about the support available, some important dates and key information regarding their exams, both mock and real, but if you do have any questions please feel free to either ask at the parents' evening or email me directly.

Attendance

Attendance is important at all stages of a child's education but especially in year 11. There is a direct correlation between attendance and success in exams and coursework. A child is classed as persistently absent if they miss 10% of their time in school, these students are less likely to make their expected progress by the end of Year 11. This also has a significant knock on effect to their Post 16 options. Each day lost in school equates to at least 5 and a half hours of lost learning time. Students need to catch up on any work they have missed and assessments may need to be completed in controlled conditions. If these are missed this could significantly impact a child's overall grade. Parents' Evening

This is an important evening to make sure you are kept up-to-date on your child's progress. You have the chance to discuss how they are progressing and how best to work together to support them to achieve their best possible GCSE results. This is taking place on **Thursday 16th November** at school and the booking system is now live. The system can be accessed through the parents tab on the school website.

Mock Exams and Information Evening

Mock exams in all subject areas will take place between **8th January 2024 and 19th January 2024.** This will be a valuable opportunity for students to undergo the examination experience and showcase their knowledge and skills gained so far in their courses. Exam timetables will be issued to students by the beginning of December. To help you support your children at home with the preparation of these exams, we would like to invite you to a Parent Information Evening on **Monday 27th November** at 6pm in the Main Hall. Staff from the Core subjects and Humanities will be present to offer advice, information and revision strategies.

Period 6 and Homework

To ensure that we are best serving our Year 11s this term, we have a number of P6 sessions in place to support your child. These P6 sessions are carefully planned and led by a teacher to improve understanding of key concepts and harder to grasp topics in order to tackle exams questions successfully. There are also coursework catch up and practical sessions for some subjects. We strongly urge your child to attend as many P6 sessions as possible each week, and their teachers and tutors will be encouraging them to do so. Period 6 sessions run from 3:15pm - 4:15pm each day and the timetable can be found on the website here: https://www.tkasa.org.uk/extra-curricular

Year 11 homework is set by teachers and recorded on class charts. The standard and completion of homework is monitored and your child may be placed in homework support to help them with this. It is essential that your child is completing their homework as this will support them to achieve in their GCSEs.
